## Juror for Prince Street Gallery's "Second National Juried Exhibition" was distinguished critic, Irving Sandler.

RVING SANDLER was an early supporter of alternative art spaces and artist-run galleries, and has served on the boards of a number of artists' organizations. He is Professor Emeritus of Art History, SUNY Purchase, New York, and is currently Visiting Professor at Hunter College. In addition to his influential books on the history of American Art, his most recent book is A Sweeper-Up After Artists: A Memoir. Artist and Critic, Robert **Berlind**, gave a lecture at the opening. He is a frequent contributor to Art in America and he is represented by Tibor de Nagy Gallery.

Hundreds of co-op artistmembers over these years have sustained and enhanced an important art-world phenomenon that enriched everyone's experience, artist and art lovers alike."
